In general, inadequate emphasis is placed on the magnitude of the responsibility a young adolescent accepts when accepting a babysitting job.

Most young adolescents lack the knowledge of first aid, rescue skills, behavior management techniques, and life experiences necessary for handling medical, behavioral, or household emergencies which might occur.

Successful completion of an educational program addressing these competencies should be a community standard for all those who care for children.



Dr. Keener developed Safe Sitter® as a medically accurate instructional program designed for young teens, no younger than 11. Dr. Keener has been recognized nationally for the educational excellence of the Safe Sitter® program by the American Academy of Pediatrics.
