The Foundation has been extremely helpful in enabling me to do my job. As the Home Health and Hospice Social Worker, I am often called upon by our nurses to assist patients or their families with needs they can not afford. I assess the situations individually and if the patient's need is not financially affordable, then I am able to use the donated funds to the Foundation to meet their needs.

In the past few months the Foundation purchased a hospice patient new shoes. She is on Medicaid and in the nursing home. It would have taken her several months of saving to purchase the shoes she needed. I bought another patient a grab bar for her tub which now allows her to bathe more independently. Also a home health patient needed a hand held shower head and grab bars for his shower. The Foundation purchased these items as he could not afford them, but his son was able to do the

installation. A final example is that I have a hospice patient who likes fresh fruit. He and his wife are in the nursing home and do not get the luxury of this so I purchase them fresh fruit upon their request.

I wish all donors could walk in my shoes on the days I get the pleasure of delivering these small items to our patients. It is a true blessing what Foundation funds do for our agency and our patients. It also shows even small gifts can provide large blessings.

Hospice Care

Hospice care has been around since the Middle Ages; it was called: hospitium. During this time the dying person lived in the guest house near the monastery, a sanctuary that provided care for the dying poor. The ill patient received food, clothing, and comfort until their death. Similar hospice care continued and was most popular in England.

In 1967, this tradition was continued in the United States by Dr. Cicely Saunders, known as the founder of the hospice we provide today. Her main focus was pain control and

palliative care. Palliative care is medical treatment that sets a goal to reduce the severity of diseases symptoms rather than trying to reverse the progression of the terminal

illness. Her focus was on the body, mind, and spirit. Dr. Saunders's aspirations were set for the terminal patient and their family; to reduce pain and suffering, to improve the quality of life for time remaining, and to provide a place of comfort for patients to do things they wanted—read, talk, take a walk, bird watch, or even get their hair done. Dr. Saunders died in the hospice she founded in 2005, at the age of 87.

Our hospice today works much the same way. We do not have a hospice facility, but bring our hospice to the patient; either in their home or long term care facility. We pro-

vide compassion with skilled nursing care to the patient in the comfort of where they live. Support is given to the terminal patient and their family so they may find meaning and purpose in their life; while maintaining the dignity and comfort during the end of life processes. When the hospice team can provide physical, social, psychological and spiritual needs to the patient and family during the dying process, then meaningful closure can be obtained to life's completion.

Jim Hansen once said, "We are not the best because we are the oldest, we are the oldest because we are the best". We were the first hospice in Pike County and we will always be here as long as you need us.

Giving from the Heart

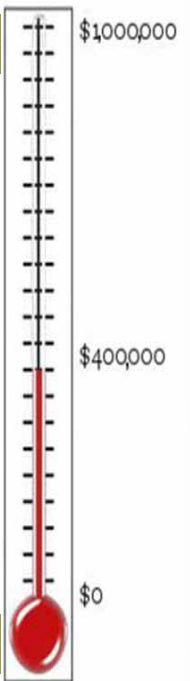
The quality care provided to our patients has greatly impacted family members in one way or another. One family wrote a letter explaining how our agency made a difficult situation a little easier.
